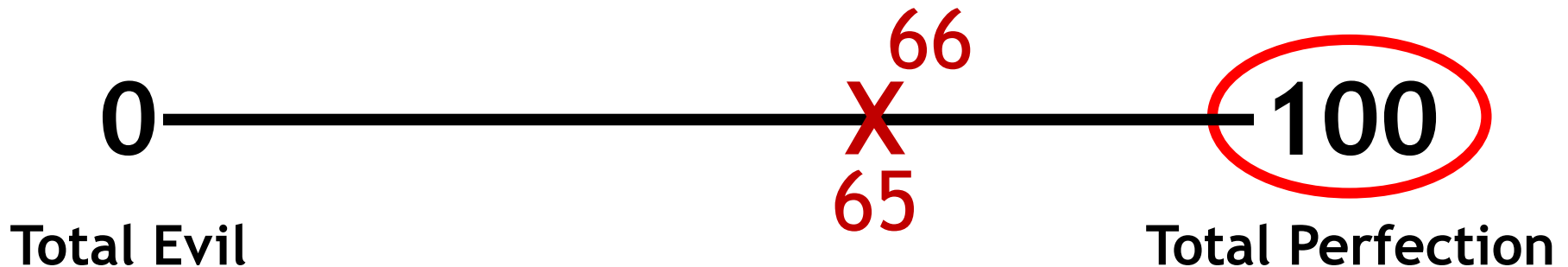

## **GOD IS HOLY**

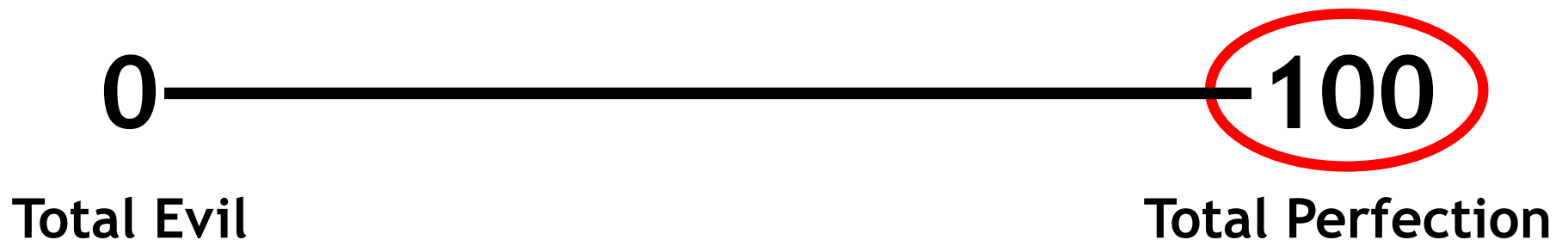
*So how can sinful people be made compatible with Him?*

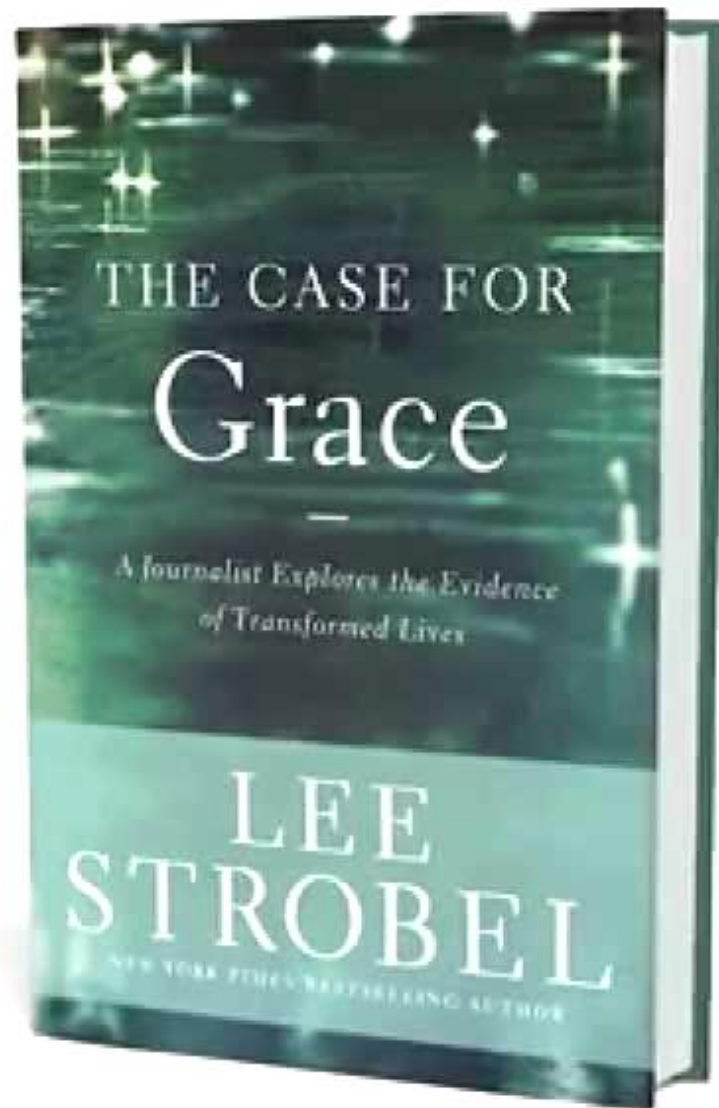
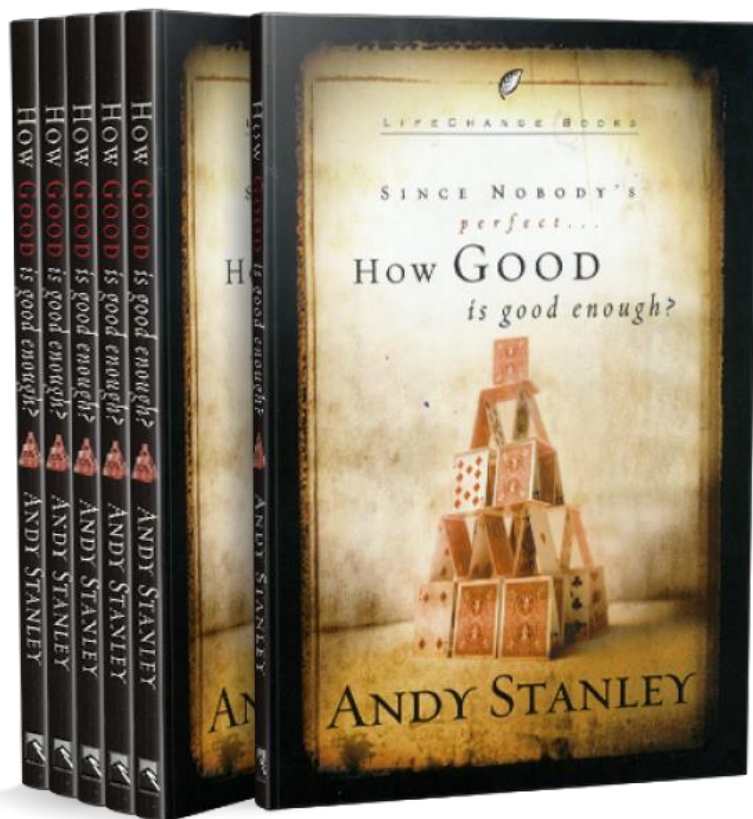

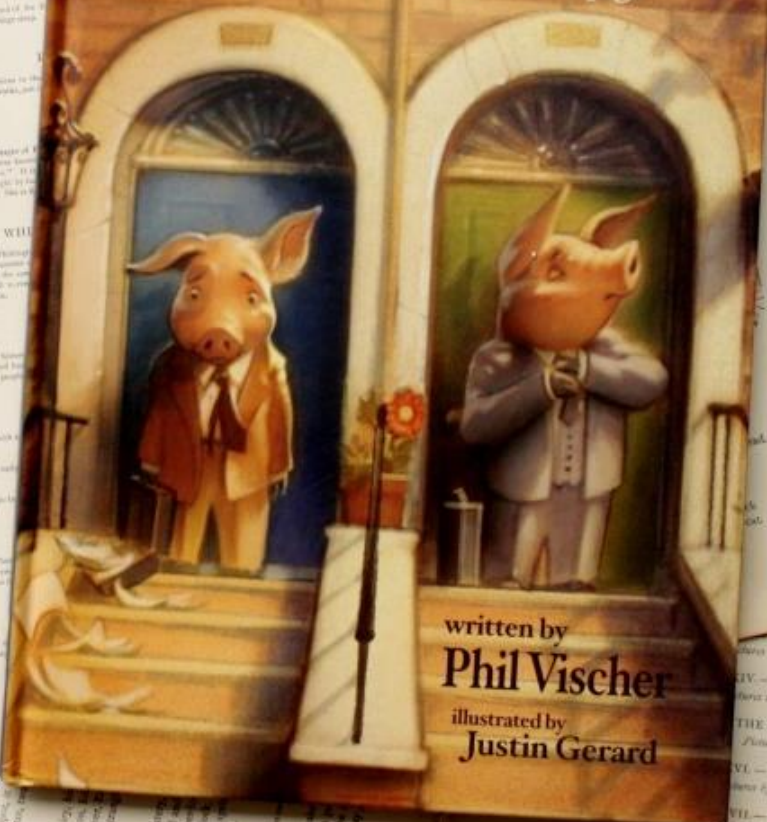
