Vision:

- Students who caught and implemented a multiplication vision during college

Foundation:

- Students who sacrificed grades, relationships, other activities to become a disciple
- Students whose lives were transformed when they made Christ lord
- Students who had an extraordinary passion or commitment to:
 - Prayer
 - Time in the Word
 - Scripture Memory
 - Worship
 - Servanthood
 - Holiness
 - Personal Discipline
 - Teachability
- Examples of contagious community drawing non christian students
- Examples of students facing persecution for their faith (US and International)
- Negative examples of potential laborers being overcome by:
 - Pride
 - Immorality
 - o fear/anxiety
 - Dating foolishly
 - Bitterness

Evangelism:

- Students with a passion for interceding for the lost
- Students who came to faith after a relational evangelism process
- Students who came to faith through "random" evangelism or gospel appointments
- Reluctant students who gained a heart for evangelism after stepping out in obedience to share

Establishing:

- Students who led others to Christ and followed up well
- Students who came to faith but fell away because they were not followed up well
- Students who modeled intentional/ relational 1-1 discipleship with other students
- Students who used the reproducible method used to disciple them to disciple others
- Examples and impact of successful student led discipleship groups

Equipping:

- Examples of students who demonstrated F.A.I.T.H.
- Students who equipped other students by ministering with them
- Students who led other students on a ministry team
- Examples of student involvement in multiplying campus-wide movements

Exporting:

- Campuses that have launched multiple students to the unreached
- Students who became World Christians during college
- Students who overcame obstacles to going:
 - Family opposition
 - Fear of support raising
 - Financial barriers (student debt)
 - Fear of giving up security or chance of marriage
- Stories of people who labored as students and continue to make disciples after college
